CHAP is not a legally recognized organization, but is locally acknowledged and has been in existence for over 20 years. It is a group comprised of 157 agencies and individuals providing a full range of services, including outreach, emergency services and shelter, transitional housing, permanent housing, case management and supportive services to the homeless and at-risk-of-homelessness populations. It also includes funders, local newspapers, city/county/state agencies, and interested/involved individuals. CHAP is chaired by the Executive Director of Homeward Pikes Peak (HPP), the CoC's Permanent Coordinating Organization. The body meets monthly with an open forum agenda designed to facilitate discussion of the most pressing needs facing the community as well as addressing the formal requirements of the CoC. Anyone in the community is welcome and all are encouraged to participate. CHAP members comprise the committees which do the detailed work of the CoC.

As lead agencies, City of Colo Sprgs, Homeward Pikes Peak & Pikes Peak United Way are assigned members. Others are voluntary; everyone is invited. We have active representation from mainstream providers which facilitates our focus on collaboration/partnership. We actively recruit when we find gaps in participation. The goal is that all parties have access to & participate in the CoC processes. This open, transparent & inclusive process ensures fairness & broad involvement in planning, decision-making, program & service delivery, & communication throughout the CoC. CHAP is also the forum for identifying the technical assistance & education needs of providers, which HPP, in turn, provides or facilitates.

The executive director of Homeward Pikes Peak (our PCO) is the chair of CHAP and a member of all committees. The representatives of the CoC Lead (City of Colorado Springs) and HMIS Lead (Pikes Peak United Way) are required members of all committees. All other members are voluntary and open participation is actively encouraged. We have a list of organizations/individuals to be represented on the Strategic Planning Committee. This ensures involvement of all mainstream providers and other provider categories. In addition, specific participation is recruited for specific priorities (e.g., current activities include respite care; housing for veterans & advocacy for VASH vouchers; 1 congregation/1 family; and planning for a unified funding agency). The list is reviewed and maintained in order to ensure currency and alignment with goals.

**If administrative funds were made available to the CoC, will the primary-decision making body, or its designee, have the capacity to be responsible for activities such as applying for HUD funding and serving as a grantee, providing project oversight, and monitoring? Explain (limit to 750 characters):**

Yes. CHAP is governed by the CoC's PCO: Homeward Pikes Peak (HPP). As a registered 501(c)(3) corporation, HPP has the capacity to apply for HUD funding, serve as grantee, & provide project oversight & monitoring. We are actively pursuing how to implement the UFA concept, including the fiscal management and review as well as enhanced project and outcomes measurement and monitoring. Funding for administrative funds would be particularly welcome for HPP. As the PCO, whenever HPP raises funds in the community, it reduces the available pool of funds for direct homeless services supplied by providers. While all needs including administration must be balanced, federal support for the required CoC activities would greatly assist our community.

Through provider/stakeholder discussions (CHAP, HMIS Advisory Committee, Homeward Pikes Peak, and city and county housing & community development organizations), we reviewed our PIT (sheltered & unsheltered), HIC, and HMIS data. We took into account agency wait lists and capacity to take new clients, the plans for the HPRP and NSP funds, the potential for a third set of VASH vouchers, and our local economic situation. We are evaluating the potential to reduce transitional housing in favor of more prevention and permanent housing. In the end, because we are in the middle of an HMIS system conversion, we decided to leave the unmet need unchanged from 2010 until we have better reporting from our HMIS.

We are in the middle of converting from VisionLink to Adsystem (expected completion 11/11) so this list will change greatly in 2012. Our old HMIS could not generate automatically several of the items listed. The vendor added CSV versions of the required reports; these currently have bugs. We have the ability to export any/all data from HMIS, so we manipulated/analyzed it to get what was required. We have pre-set exports; we use EXCEL tools to make reporting easier; we continue to work with the vendor to create/fix needed reporting tools. Despite the limitations, we submitted all AHAR categories (incl. veterans) in 2010 & will submit all categories in 2011. We supported all QPR & APR needs. These efforts are VERY time/people intensive. We have concentrated on data quality to facilitate the system conversion. We expect the new HMIS to be administration-intensive, but to better meet agency & CoC needs & entice additional participants due to greater functionality & ease of use.

Our overall bed coverage (ES+TH+PH) is currently 82%. The PH category is 59% (a drop from 65% in 2010 due to new VASH beds). All of the non-HMIS PH beds are VA-related. The VA programs committed to participating early this year, but have been holding off until we completed the migration to our new HMIS. As soon as we train them and get their existing beds covered in HMIS, this will improve PH coverage to 100% and overall coverage to 96%. This should be completed by the time of PIT count in January 2012.

We run monthly DQ reports & review them with agencies. We provide training and re-training to users on data entry, how to use the data quality reports, & how to run regular QPRs and APRs to monitor data reasonableness. Focus is on missing and incorrect data. Data now showing decrease in blank/refused/don't know. We show the users where in the CoC application & APRs the data is used & quality reported in order to put the need in context. We work with agencies to use the data more for regular business reporting. This puts more inside-the-agency emphasis on getting data right. Overall data quality is better on a larger set of data. We are mid-stream in our conversion to a new system which has more error prevention and alerts.

The policy is to do program entries & exits in a timely fashion (real-time or within a few days). All data entry must be completed by the end of the month where QPRs/APRs are required. Monthly data quality reports include program entry/exit data. We review current active client reports & check for reasonableness or even against an independent count (such as an separate bed assignment report). Both systems have entry date, exit date, & status, so we also compare exit dates and status (no exit date should = enrolled, exit date should = exited). The new system workflow & reports assist this process by preventing errors. Finally, we check that every client has at least one program entry unless status = denied.

**Comparing the most recent point-in-time count to the previous point-in-time count, describe any factors that may have resulted in an increase, decrease, or no change in both the sheltered and unsheltered population counts (limit 1500 characters).**

The sheltered population decreased 4% (891 to 854) mostly due to tighter reporting requirements for non-HMIS providers. This was in TH & due to faith-based programs no longer reserving beds for the homeless. Utilization has increased since 1/11 due to continued economic issues, so 2012 could see an increase if this remains steady. The unsheltered population decreased 70% (572 to 170). In 2010 we had a significant camping crisis due to the real factor of the economy & an artificial factor of a camping ordinance suspension which resulted in mass congregation of our campers & thus a more complete count. In response to the 2010 count, we launched a motel-style ES, had increased church response, & our outreach program moved significant numbers into recovery, housing 1st, or other PH programs locally & in clients' hometowns (program and/or support availability was confirmed prior to arranging transportation). The motel-style ES had a 70% success rate, helped many to find jobs (no one has been fired to-date) or access mainstream benefits, & rapidly returned households to stability (average program stay about 2 months). We got more VASH vouchers which were completely filled; more have been requested to accommodate a significant wait list. Our outreach team estimates that the current number is ~250 (up from 1/11) & is mostly chronic plus new arrivals of people who heard about our outreach & placement efforts.

We began the process of verifying/updating our housing inventory in 9/2010. This was used as the basis for determining providers to be included during the PIT. This was reviewed/updated again as part of the PIT/HIC survey in 1/2011. Providers who were not yet using HMIS used a survey instrument matched to the data we collect in our HMIS and covering all data elements needed for CoC reports. Training was provided on the use of the survey. The training included a copy of the charts/reports the CoC must generate so that survey takers would understand the significance of each data element. A phone survey gathered the number of active clients for comparison to the number of surveys received. After the PIT, the survey data was then put into an EXCEL spreadsheet. Providers who were using HMIS were reminded to ensure that all data was current and accurate for active clients on the date of the PIT. Data quality was reviewed and worked as needed, including review of required data elements and program entry and exit dates. Also, a phone survey was conducted asking for the number of active clients on the date of the PIT. This was compared to our HMIS data and discrepancies resolved. Data from our HMIS was exported and added to the EXCEL spreadsheet to provide a single set of client data.

The data was collected as described in 2I. The survey instrument included all of the data elements and response categories (including refused/don't know) needed to determine the subpopulations numbers. Our HMIS participants agree to collect all of the program-specific data elements, including most of the optional ones plus a couple of community-specific items. Our HMIS creates a PIN for each client based on name, date of birth, SSN, & gender. All participating providers enter this information & our data quality is very high on these elements. Our HMIS does prevent duplication within a provider, but not between providers as data sharing is not in use at this time. The HMIS also does not automatically generate a de-duplicated count. Therefore, we exported the data into an EXCEL file & used the PIN, the EXCEL data de-duplication tools, & a manual review/assessment of potential duplicates (based on the identifying fields) to remove the duplicate clients before doing the rest of the PIT data analysis. Our paper survey form asked the same client identifying questions. This data was entered into the same EXCEL spreadsheet. Though we did not have a PIN for these clients, we used the EXCEL data de-duplication tools and manual review/assessment based on the identifying data elements to de-duplicate across HMIS participant data & paper survey data.

For HMIS providers, we provided instructions/training and reminders on what data needed to be completed, reviewed, and verified and in what timeframe. This was done in our regular users meeting and via email. We also fielded phone calls and placed phone calls if we did not receive email responses. We pulled data quality/completeness reports and provided these to the providers. This covered all of the data elements required for the populations and sub-populations counts. Data was also reviewed when pulled for analysis and problems addressed. For non-HMIS providers, we held training sessions prior to the PIT. The training included detailed instructions on the survey form and the importance and relevance of the data elements, as well as the date of the PIT. Reminders were also provided by email and phone if needed. Survey forms were reviewed prior to and during data entry, and problems were addressed.

Our outreach team and service providers have worked hard in the last year to establish relationships of trust with many/most of our unsheltered homeless. The VA has been reaching out to vets. The geographic size and configuration of our area makes it difficult to de-duplicate using simple counts (without identifying information). Therefore we adopted a policy of including only those for whom we had adequate information to de-duplicate. Surveys were taken at our soup kitchen (only 1 on weekdays and most eat here regularly), service providers, homeless health clinic, detox, and in known gathering places. The VA surveyed the people who accessed their services. In addition, our outreach team walked the creek beds and known camping areas. Based on outreach, the estimate was 198 and we accounted for 170 at the time of the PIT. The difference would be people we could not find and who did not access services on that day. The number also under-represents people who are homeless but not 'known' such as those who might be living in cars, etc., on the day of the PIT. The data gathered was entered into the same EXCEL spreadsheet used for the sheltered population (HMIS and non-HMIS). This ensured that we did not count as unsheltered someone who was already counted in a program somewhere.

For the street outreach part of the survey, the survey takers were the outreach team. Their knowledge of the people they were interviewing and the level of trust already established helped to ensure accurate information from people who might otherwise have been reluctant.

**Describe the techniques, as selected above, used by the CoC to reduce the occurrence of counting unsheltered homeless persons more than once during the most recent point-in-time count (limit 1500 characters):**

Our paper survey form contained all of the identifying elements (name, DOB, SSN, gender). Anyone who was to be taking surveys was trained prior to the PIT, and the training included detailed instructions on the form and the significance of the data elements, with emphasis on un-duplicated counts. Copies of the required CoC charts were provided to show context for the data. Though the survey data did not include a PIN, it did include all of the identifying information which is used to make up the PIN in our HMIS. The data was entered onto the same EXCEL spreadsheet we used for our HMIS and non-HMIS housing providers. In the data analysis, we eliminated people for whom we did not have enough information to de-duplicate. We did not have to have all of the elements, but enough to eliminate duplicates. Therefore, we were able to ensure that people were counted only once and in the appropriate category (sheltered or unsheltered).

**Describe the CoCs efforts to reduce the number of unsheltered homeless households with dependent children. Discussion should include the CoCs outreach plan (limit 1500 characters):**

We reduced the number of unsheltered HHs w/ children from 24 to 0 through the HPRP program, the opening of the motel-style ES, & efforts of the outreach team to locate & place HHs w/ children immediately. Organizations which serve homeless HHs w/ children notify our local 2-1-1 when they have openings. This information is used for referrals, disseminated to our CHAP distribution list & at our meetings. Eligible households can be identified & connected with the available housing resources. Providers analyze clients who are being refused so that the CoC can determine if/when programs with different requirements are needed. We continue to see new HH w/ children due to the economy. We addressed this in several ways. Four of the providers receiving HPRP funds specifically moved HHs w/ children quickly into housing, & four providers receiving HPRP funds focused on prevention. Local funding switched from all campers to an emphasis on HHs w/ children. All of the HPRP and HUD CoC recipients are using HMIS to ensure coordination, non-duplication, and comprehensive service to clients. HPRP & some local resources are almost depleted so we are evaluating options to continue this successful approach. Our major soup kitchen (faith-based, non-HUD recipient) has expanded associated services, is actively engaging HHs w/ children (& those without), & is connecting them with available resources while also monitoring progress toward self-sufficiency.

**Describe the CoCs efforts to identify and engage persons that routinely sleep on the streets or other places not meant for human habitation (limit 1500 characters):**

The soup kitchen effort is mentioned above. Our Resource Advocacy Program (RAP) engages street clients over an extended period of time to build trust, provide counseling, introduce resources, & eventually stabilize & house clients. Our Homeless Outreach Team (HOT) of police officers regularly engage w/ the homeless population. They have gained the trust of the population & the providers, & have worked successfully with our RAP & Housing First programs to move chronic homeless into housing, & to direct those not yet ready for housing to other resources. We had 2 mental health workers working with the HOT team. Together, they continue to reach out to the not-ready group to keep & enhance the dialogue & trust-building. This program won an international award for creativity & effectiveness & is being modeled in other cities. Our homeless health clinic has a mobile van which goes to known locations/encampments & engages & serves clients. We have a soup truck which provides an evening meal at a central downtown location. Other providers come to that location in order to engage clients. Our community mental health organization has an outreach program which goes to the soup kitchen, health clinic, & other locations to engage clients & provide mental health counseling. We received a SAMHSA grant which has expanded this effort & moved more chronic homeless into supportive housing. We have just launched an SSFV program which will be another resource for veterans.

### **3A. Continuum of Care (CoC) Strategic Planning Objectives**

#### **Objective 1: Create new permanent housing beds for chronically homeless persons.**

##### **Instructions:**

Ending chronic homelessness continues to be a HUD priority. CoCs can do this by creating new permanent housing beds that are specifically designated for this population. In the FY2010 NOFA, chronically homeless persons were defined as an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition, or a family where at least one adult member had a disabling condition, who has either been continuously homeless for at least a year OR has had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three (3) years.

CoCs are to describe the short-term and long-term plans for creating new permanent housing beds for chronically homeless persons who meet the definition of chronically homeless. CoCs will also indicate the current number of permanent housing beds designated for chronically homeless persons. This number should match the number of beds reported in the FY2011 Housing Inventory Count (HIC) and enter into the Homeless Data Exchange (HDX). **Describe the CoC's short-term (12 month) plan to create new permanent housing beds for persons who meet HUD's definition of chronically homeless (limit 1000 characters):**



We saw a major increase in CH beds this year due to the inclusion of CH beds for HHs w/ children. We received an additional 25 VASH vouchers. This increase coupled with the expansion to include HHs w/ children led to an increase in people/beds from 35 to 98. For the same reason, another S+C program increased from 55 to 78. Twenty-five more VASH vouchers have been granted to our region and staff is being hired. However, these are not all reserved for CH. We also have 8 beds which were approved in the 2010 PH housing bonus (SHP-PH) which are just coming into service. These will be targeted to clients entering Housing First who are not ready for the extensive supportive services offered in S+C units. The two sources are expected to provide at least 15 new beds in the next 12 months. In addition, an SSVF award in Colorado will target primarily our CoC. This program will be a good partnership with our PH-CH providers.

**Describe the CoC's long-term (10 year) plan to create new permanent housing beds for persons who meet HUD's definition of chronically homeless (limit 1000 characters):**

Our goal is 5 new PH-CH beds annually thru PH bonus grants & VASH vouchers. This is realistic & consistent w/ experience in obtaining funding, match requirements & supportive services. The long term target could increase next year. We have a large military presence in our CoC. Our VA office has ~150 people (mostly CH) waiting for VASH vouchers. We are lobbying for a larger allotment in our region & the SSVF program will provide good support. Our outreach team estimates ~100 more CH homeless. We will target a portion of our PH bonus grants to serve these clients. With expanded capabilities of our new HMIS, we expect to use outcomes data & demonstrated savings from the outcomes to direct funds into program expansion. Our 1st need is still CH individuals, but we are seeing HHs w/ children due to the economy, so are balancing the two needs. We will use the data to evaluate the conversion of some TH capacity to PH while directing ESG funds to prevention & re-housing to lessen the TH need.

**Objective 2: Increase the percentage of participants remaining in CoC funded permanent housing projects for at least six months to 77 percent or more.**

**Describe the CoCs short-term (12 month) plan to increase the percentage of participants remaining in CoC-funded permanent housing projects for at least six months to 77 percent or higher (limit 1000 characters):**

Despite 10 clients receiving section 8 & leaving PH, we achieved 79% retention. This rate is sustainable given our programs & partnerships. The short-term goals from the 10-Year Plan include: develop/enhance assessment tools & life skills programs to better prepare clients; continue agency collaboration to maintain & grow housing-first program; get all PH beds covered by HMIS so that all programs can be monitored/measured consistently. The Housing First & Resource Advocacy Programs continue collaborating to ensure clients are better prepared to enter PH (thru relationship building, counseling, life skills assessment & education, & readiness assessment). This will result in a sustainable high rate of success & retention in the program. The veterans S+C and VASH programs will begin using our new HMIS this year (after conversion is complete). We will then be able to use outcome domains across all PH programs to assess entry status/needs, & measure retention in all programs.

**Describe the CoCs long-term (10 year) plan to increase the percentage of participants remaining in CoC-funded permanent housing projects for at least six months to 77 percent or higher (limit 1000 characters):**

We may adjust our goal up when we have determined the long-term sustainable percentage. For now, we left the goals at 80%. The long-term plan includes: continue development of the life skills and assessment programs addressed above; continue development of the PH capacity as described under Objective 1; promote access to mainstream benefits to create stability; and, develop a threshold mechanism (using HMIS) to alert the CoC should progress fall below the minimum standard (this is tied to the overall HMIS monitoring and progress/performance reporting which is already available in the new HMIS and will begin being used late 2011). Our outreach team works on building trust which helps ensure clients are ready for & more likely to remain stable in PH. Our SAMHSA grant is aimed specifically at clients with mental illness & one of the goals of this program is long-term housing/treatment and retention. And our VASH and SSVF programs will collaborate to house & retain veterans in PH.

**Objective 3: Increase the percentage of participants in CoC-funded transitional housing that move into permanent housing to 65 percent or more.**

**Describe the CoCs short-term (12 month) plan to increase the percentage of participants in CoC-funded transitional housing projects that move to permanent housing to 65 percent or more (limit 1000 characters).**

We have been able to consistently meet this goal & would like to see the rate higher. We have a model TH program which measures outcomes in income, employment, education, housing stability, & overall self-sufficiency. They use these measures to examine program effectiveness & make program changes to ensure greater success. With our new HMIS (conversion complete 11/2011), we will carry this model to other TH programs. Our objective is to establish baselines for success in the previously mentioned outcome areas as well as time-in-program in order to assure exit to stable housing. In HMIS, we will put emphasis on capturing full exit information (final outcome assessment including several optional fields) across the CoC. We still have non-HUD funded providers who do not participate but expect to add 2 programs due to the better functionality of the new system. This will further assist our CoC-wide performance measurement.

**Describe the CoCs long-term (10 year) plan to increase the percentage of participants in CoC-funded transitional housing projects that move to permanent housing to 65 percent or more (limit 1000 characters):**

We left the 5 and 10 year goals as is because they are achievable given the focus we have on increasing self-sufficiency of clients in TH. The long-term plan includes: evaluate and update the 5 and 10 year goals based on performance (ref. 12 month plan above); develop a threshold mechanism (using HMIS) to alert the CoC should progress fall below the minimum standard (this is tied to the overall HMIS monitoring and progress/performance reporting which will be implemented with the new HMIS); increase % of TH persons employed at program exit (to increase likelihood of moving to PH); evaluate existing program effectiveness in ensuring clients reach self-sufficiency levels needed for success and develop programs to fill gaps.

**Objective 4: Increase percentage of participants in all CoC-funded projects that are employed at program exit to 20 percent or more.**

**Describe the CoCs short-term (12 month) plan to increase the percentage of participants in all CoC-funded projects that are employed at program exit to 20 percent or more (limit 1000 characters).**

We continue to exceed our 12 mos goal because several of our programs focus heavily on employment assistance. However, many folks have part-time employment or are underemployed. For this reason & the continuing economic situation, we are leaving the 12 mos goal as it was. The short-term plans from the 10-Year Plan are: increase number of providers tracking employment data at program entry & exit; identify resources needed to support providers & clients in increasing employment. Due to the link between education & income, we added a goal to increase number of providers tracking education data at program entry & exit. We continue to increase the capacity of existing or develop new employment assistance programs such as resume-writing & interview skills. Through our new HMIS, we will begin evaluation of referrals to & delivery of employment assistance programs & develop a process for assessing employment readiness.

**Describe the CoCs long-term (10 year) plan to increase the percentage of participants in all CoC-funded projects who are employed at program exit to 20 percent or more (limit to 1000 characters):**

We adjusted our 5 and 10 year goals upward and will evaluate again next year. Our existing focus on education and employment in our current programs is working well. Our goal is to develop more formal evaluation and monitoring capability. Thus, the long-term plan includes: develop resources needed to better support providers and clients in increasing employment (as identified by short-term goal mentioned above); more fully engage our workforce planning center and employers in strategic planning; evaluate successful programs and implement lessons learned; implement employment readiness/capability evaluation process using outcome domains and employment/education data; and, develop a threshold mechanism (using HMIS) to alert the CoC should progress fall below the minimum standard (this is tied to the overall HMIS monitoring and progress/performance reporting which is available in our new HMIS).

### **3A. Continuum of Care (CoC) Strategic Planning Objectives**

#### **Objective 5: Decrease the number of homeless households with children.**

##### **Instructions:**

Ending homelessness among households with children, particularly for those households living on the streets or other places not meant for human habitation, is an important HUD priority. #### **Describe the CoCs short-term (12 month) plan to decrease the number of homeless households with children (limit 1000 characters):**

Our community is growing, has an influx of military families due to relocation of a unit to Fort Carson, & our economy is slow to recover. Our HHs w/ children remained flat but we were able to reduce the number of unsheltered. We do not expect an overall decrease in the short-term. These HHs are our top priority & are being served thru HPRP programs & a motel-style program where average return to stability has been about 2 months. A new SSFV program will address the military needs. The short-term plans include: continue homeless prevention & rapid re-housing programs & target HHs with children; establish baselines for success in the areas of income, employment, education, overall self-sufficiency, & time-in-program outcome measures; focus outreach programs on finding & engaging households with children (example: our soup kitchen & outreach programs); & implement the new HMIS outcome domains to assess clients likely to move quickly through ES and/or TH into permanent situations.



**Describe the CoCs long-term (10 year) plan to decrease the number of homeless households with children (limit 1000 characters):**

The long-term plan goals include: monitor and evaluate effectiveness of homeless prevention and rapid re-housing programs, and modify/expand as necessary; develop sustainable funding to replace/augment local foundation funding; develop and implement life skills, employment, and education programs (or increase capacity of existing programs); work with military resources to do the same for military families; and, develop a threshold mechanism (using HMIS) to alert the CoC should progress fall below the minimum standard (this is tied to the overall HMIS monitoring and progress/performance reporting which is available in our new HMIS). We are developing more PH and affordable housing options, and are evaluating moving some TH capacity to PH as prevention and RRH efforts lessen the demand on TH. We continue to work with the McKinney-Vento reps in our schools districts to quickly identify and assist homeless and at risk households w/ children.

### 3B. Continuum of Care (CoC) Discharge Planning

**Foster Care (Youth Aging Out):**

Office of Homeless Youth Services (OHYS), in Colorado Department of Local Affairs, is responsible for examining & improving discharge policies/protocols/processes for youth exiting the child welfare & juvenile justice systems. OHYS works with Departments of Corrections, Justice, Education, Health Care Policy & Financing, Human Services, Public Safety, Public Health & Environment, private nonprofit organizations, appropriate federal departments & other community stakeholders. OHYS is responsible for developing & implementing discharge planning recommendations for youth exiting systems of care. OHYS conducted a statewide survey in 2008 & continues to develop policies/processes for youth exiting systems of care. The action plan, current status & other resources are at <http://www.colorado.gov/cs/Satellite/DOLA-Main/CBON/1251595346101>. Division of Child Welfare developed & distributed a checklist for emancipation. El Paso County DHS implemented the Vital Documents guidelines, the Emancipation Services checklist, & other best practices not yet formalized at the state level. Local youth services providers (e.g. Urban Peak, Young Williams Child Support Services) collaborate with OHYS & DHS. They provide transitional housing & services to many youth exiting foster care. In 2007, the Colorado Legislature passed Senate Bill 002 that extends Medicaid coverage to Foster Care Youth from 18 years of age to 21 years of age. Local 211 refers to appropriate resources, is free & confidential.

**Health Care:**

The two hospitals in Colorado Springs/El Paso County have discharge policies addressing homeless & at-risk patients. These include guidelines for identifying such patients, finding emergency or temporary housing, providing necessary medications or access to medications, providing referrals to homeless health care options (Peak Vista Homeless Health Clinic, S.E.T. Clinic) & other support referrals, & providing transportation from the hospital to the housing facility. Hospitals & clients access 211 for other appropriate referrals. Our emergency shelter provides respite beds for homeless clients discharged from the hospital or referred by the clinic, & Peak Vista Homeless Health Clinic is located in the same building as the shelter. We have launched expanded respite services to increase discharge options & decrease hospital costs. Clients with intoxication, behavioral, and/or mental health issues are being addressed by a new detox & sobering beds facility. For the long-term medical care needs of clients, we have worked with the Colorado Department of Human Services & received a local technical assistance & training grant to implement the SOAR Initiative to increase access to SSI/SSDI & Medicaid for homeless persons with disabilities. Our CoC has a collaborative effort with the regional Social Security Administration & the State's Division of Disability Determination Services who are flagging & expediting homeless applications & measuring outcomes (speed of approval).

**Mental Health:**

The State has a discharge policy in place for the two state mental health institutions which prevents or severely limits the institutions from discharging persons to shelters or homelessness. The CoC abides by the protocol established, is a participant in the quarterly meetings of the system, & participates in policy review & revision. These quarterly meetings are attended by representatives of the state mental health services office, the mental health institutes, the community mental health centers, state drug & alcohol division, & ad hoc attendees representing other service providers. Our CoC's primary mental health provider, AspenPointe Health Services, has a full set of guidelines based on the state policies. The guidelines cover the admission, care, & discharge of all clients. AspenPointe also has a partnership with El Paso County jail to reach out to inmates suffering from mental illness & provide discharge planning with the goal of reducing recidivism by ensuring services (such as clinical care, access to & receipt of mainstream benefits, housing, & vocational training) are available upon release. AspenPointe & clients access 211 for free & confidential referrals to other appropriate services. If people with mental health issues do become homeless, then the Resource Advocacy Program and Homeless Outreach Team (which includes 2 mental health workers) work to connect them quickly to available resources.

**Corrections:**

CO HB 02-1295 established procedures to access benefits for offenders exiting the corrections. Dept. of Corrections works w/ CoCs to implement the legislation. Colorado Community & Interagency Council on Homelessness created an innovative integrated treatment & diversion program for jails. The Dept. of Corrections Community Re-Entry Specialists work w/ parole officers, faith & community based organizations, case managers, education staff, & the community at large thru direct & brokered services statewide to support the development & implementation of offender transition plans. These plans include support services providing resources necessary to successfully transition the offender back into the community, function successfully on their own, & enhance public safety. El Paso County offers the Reintegration & Recovery Program which includes needs assessment/diagnosis, extensive life skills education/counseling (anger management, therapy, substance treatment, family/parenting, etc.), employment programs (during & after incarceration), legal assistance, housing, & transportation. The program has shown significant cost savings by reducing recidivism by 67%, increased employment rates thru partner businesses, access to mainstream benefits, reduction in return to homelessness, & increased sobriety among clients. S.E.T. Clinic offers the comprehensive health care re-entry program to exiting offenders. Our outreach team works to identify & assist offenders who do become homeless.

### 3C. Continuum of Care (CoC) Coordination

**If yes, list the goals in the CoC strategic plan that are included in the Consolidated Plan:** The City of Colorado Springs 2010-2014 plan references and supports the CoC's 10-Year Blueprint to Serve Every Homeless Citizen in the Pikes Peak Region, specifically addressing development & implementation of CoC strategic goals, provision of housing to meet CoC goals, homeless prevention & rapid re-housing, & provision of support in achieving other CoC goals. The 2011 annual action plan also reference the current CoC plan of record. El Paso County developed its 2009-2011 Consolidated Plan and 2011 annual action plans in coordination with the CoC. The plan cites the homeless prevention, rapid re-housing, affordable housing, and emergency assistance goals of the 10 Year Plan. Both Consolidated Plans cite & use the PIT & HIC data provided by the CoC, as well as the output from our planning sessions.

**Describe how the CoC is participating in or coordinating with the local Homeless Prevention and Rapid re-housing Program (HPRP) initiative, as indicated in the substantial amendment to the Consolidated Plan 2008 Action Plan (1500 character limit):**

The HPRP funds are managed by the City of Colorado Springs which is also the CoC Lead Organization. The request for proposals, review of proposals, & award of funds were done in coordination with the CoC, following the same processes used by the CoC. We continued to have homeless individuals & families who have never been homeless before & who by all measures are likely to succeed if we can prevent loss of housing or re-house quickly, & then keep this population housed. Still, the January 2011 PIT showed a significant decrease in our unsheltered homeless and HPRP funds were part of the reason. The HPRP funds have prevented homelessness, & increased the total number of people served in of our ES & TH programs by more rapidly moving people back into housing. The grantees were selected with these two goals in mind. In addition to the City of Colorado Springs funds, we received an allocation from the state to be used for general El Paso County. These funds are also managed by the City of Colorado Springs, & focus heavily on homeless prevention (the greatest need in the rural areas). All HPRP recipients are HMIS participants. The agencies are coordinating evaluation/acceptance/denial of clients and ensuring non-duplication of services delivered through the HMIS. Data Quality reports & QPRs are produced from the CoC HMIS. 94% of City HPRP funds have been expended to date and approximately 89% of the State funds have been expended.

**Describe how the CoC is participating in or coordinating with any of the following: Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) initiative, HUD VASH, or other HUD managed American Reinvestment and Recovery Act programs (2500 character limit)?**

The CoC & the City of Colorado Springs work together in the development & implementation of the CoC programs. The Neighborhood Stabilization Program is managed by the City of Colorado which is also the CoC Lead Organization. The City has coupled its NSP funding with the State of Colorado and two multi-family projects have been purchased. A unit with 24 2-bedroom apartments was purchased. 22 of the units are rented to persons who are between 30 and 55% of AMI. The second multi-family project consisting of 21 units has been purchased and rehabilitated. 10 of the units in this project have been set aside for chronically homeless persons. NSP-3 funds were also awarded to the City and negotiations to purchase a 36 unit multi-family housing complex is underway. These units will be rented to individuals and families between 30 and 60% AMI. In addition CDBG-R funds have been used to provide energy efficiency retro-fits. Due to the City's involvement in the CoC every effort is made to utilize HUD funding in a complementary manner with CoC funding. The CoC is working closely with the Veteran's Administration on the delivery of HUD VASH in our community, identifying & referring veterans who are eligible for vouchers. The CoC has worked with regional HUD &VA offices to make 2 more allotments of VASH vouchers available to our CoC. We continue these efforts because we still have ~150 veterans on a waiting list. A representative from the VA is a regular member of the CHAP committee in our community and works with us on this coordination. Colorado was also awarded an SSVF grant, the majority of which will be expended in El Paso County. The grantee will work in partnership with the CoC and the VA to provide complementary services to our veterans.

**If yes, please describe the established policies that are in currently in place.** Homeless service providers are required to ensure that families are advised of their rights & available McKinney-Vento services. Each school district has a McKinney-Vento contact and these are the people with whom the service providers work. Children must be or get enrolled in order for the family to remain in the program (agencies work with them to ensure this happens). If families leave a program with children not enrolled, the Department of Human Services is notified. The service providers must work with the school districts to ensure transportation is provided to the school of record. We have an early learning initiative aimed at improving 3rd grade reading levels which providers support and participate in as appropriate for their programs. Providers work with child care providers to ensure that need is met.

**Describe the CoC's efforts to collaborate with local education agencies to assist in the identification of homeless families and inform them of their eligibility for McKinney-Vento education services. (limit 1500 characters)**

All school districts in the CoC have McKinney-Vento coordinators, & the CoC meets with them regularly to ensure the needs of our homeless children are being met. The two lowest income districts in our region are particularly responsive, generally having all services requested, including school lunches and private transportation to the home school of record, in place within 24 hours. The school districts provide information to all students & parents alerting them to services available. The school districts also include a survey at the beginning of the year. One of the questions provides information to indicate homeless or at risk families. Teachers are trained to identify potentially homeless children & work with their coordinators to ensure services are made available. All school districts are required to provide transportation to the child's school of record. Our food bank and a faith-based organization provide weekend food back-packs. We have several organizations who provide school supplies and immunization/health clinics. Schools provide information on these services to families, and they refer people to our 211 Information & Referral line which maintains current lists of these and other programs/services in the community.

**Describe how the CoC has, and will continue, to consider the educational needs of children when families are placed in emergency or transitional shelter. (limit 1500 characters)**

Colorado Springs/El Paso County is a very large geographical area with many school districts. Our homeless housing facilities are primarily located in one of the school districts due to access to mainstream and other services and transportation. In order to compensate, our school districts work together to provide transportation to the home school for the children. For the sake of the children, the buses pick up first and drop off last at the shelter, or transportation is provided by qualified/certified individuals. The early learning initiative programs and Head Start program through Community Partnership for Child Development are broadly available throughout the community, and our homeless providers coordinate with these efforts. Child care and learning facilities/programs are provided within or in proximity to most of our family programs. Our large ES facility has a child discovery center on site where parents and children can receive counseling and services, and have a place to work together. Most of our TH programs provide access to computers in some fashion to support both students and parents. If there is a need, we work to meet it.

**Describe the CoC's current efforts to combat homelessness among veterans. We have a large military population & a large # of homeless veterans. The CoC has a lead role in finding & assisting homeless veterans. Our outreach team regularly visits campgrounds & homeless gathering places. When veterans are identified, we work to assure their basic needs are met. If veteran-specific shelter is not available, we provide shelter in our locally-funded motel-style program. This provides food, clothing & basic medical care while these individuals wait to be seen by the VA & to acquire their VA & other benefits. We contact the local homeless veterans coordinator (a member of CHAP) to gain access to VASH & other programs. HPP continues to work w/ regional HUD & VA directors to get more VASH vouchers for our CoC to meet the housing needs identified. Our housing 1st & other programs are open to veterans, & transfer to VASH is facilitated as possible. All of our service providers work w/ veterans to access benefits. Many of our providers are run & staffed by veterans, so the needs of veterans are high priority in our community. El Pomar Foundation has a military affairs director who works to assure funding for Colorado veterans; programs. Denver Options received an SSVF grant; the manager & 6 of 8 case workers are in Colo Sprgs to focus on our veterans & provide supportive services. Our two new grants (2011), if approved, will further expand PH housing for veterans. These cover our goals of outreach, collaboration, continuum of services, & improved lives.

**Describe the CoC's current efforts to address the youth homeless population. Youth homelessness is important & of concern in our CoC. Our primary provider, Urban Peak, is a licensed shelter serving this vulnerable group. Urban Peak provides a dormitory-style ES for male & female youth, including showers, lockers/storage, kitchen/dining facilities serving meals, group spaces, admin/outreach/staff offices, computer lab, health clinic, & recreational space. It operates a PH program for youth w/ disabilities & a scattered site TH for youth w/ income, supported w/ HUD funding. Urban Peak offers a full range of supportive services: intensive case management including counseling, substance abuse treatment, mental health services, & life skills; employment; education including on-site GED. Urban Peak reaches over 300 youth annually thru model outreach. Using a Positive Youth Development Model, Urban Peak staff builds trust & guides youth to identify unique abilities & strengths to reach their full potential. Participation is voluntary; outcomes are positive; support systems are real; expectations are high & realistic. Youth earn a donated bicycle by enrolling in school, getting a job, or securing housing; they learn to build, repair & maintain their bikes for use as transportation/exercise/recreation. Our CoC has a Teen Court program & youth detention center that focuses on life skills & support systems to assist youth exiting from corrections. These efforts cover the CoC strategic goals of outreach, collaboration, continuum of services & improved lives.

Objective 1 - PH Beds: We exceeded the goal but a note is in order. The jump was due in part to the inclusion of CH beds for HHs w/ children. The beds for individuals increased to 130 vs. the goal of 120. The remaining 60 were for HHs w/ children.

Objective 2 - Remain in PH: The goal was 80% and we achieved 79%. We had 10 PH clients receive section 8 vouchers and move out before 6 months stay in the program. This brought our achievement down (it would have been 84%) but was good for those clients and the new ones who took their PH openings.

Objective 5 - Homeless HH w/ Children: The number of HHs w/ children increased from 92 to 93, but decreased from 12 to 3 in the unsheltered population. We continue to see new homeless HHs w/ children due to the economy. However, we house them very rapidly through the HPRP program and our new locally funded motel-style ES.

APRs are submitted to the CoC as well as to HUD, and we can pull them directly from HMIS for all of our programs (all HUD CoC funded programs are using HMIS). APRs are reviewed and problem areas are identified. Our programs all assist clients with accessing mainstream programs. We are migrating to a new HMIS (completion 11/2011) which will expand our monitoring and reporting capabilities. When the new system is operational, we will set and report on mainstream program access goals. Currently, the formal review is annual because of the difficulty involved with our old HMIS. Our goal will be to review 2-4 times per year as we improve the process.

Mainstream program providers are members of the CHAP committee & attend monthly meetings which begin with updates from all organizations. Meetings include topics on accessing mainstream resources (SSI/SSDI, Medicare/Medicaid, CCAP, TANF, AND, Food Stamps, etc.): 11/10/10 - I.D. card acquisition; 2/10/11 - veterans trauma court; 3/10/11 - S.O.A.R.; 4/14/11 - immigration services; 5/12/11 - child support services and parent opportunity program (DHS); 8/11/11 - services for persons w/ disabilities; 9/8/11 - services for persons w/ HIV/AIDS. However, our providers do know based on the data collected in HMIS who is likely to be eligible, and do record in HMIS the status, and amounts where applicable, for all of the following: unemployment, SSI, SSDI, veterans' disability, private disability insurance, workers' compensation, TANF, general assistance, SS retirement, veterans' pension, job pension, child support, alimony/spousal support, Needy and Disabled, old age pension, food stamps, Medicaid, Medicare, state childrens' health insurance, WIC, VA medical, TANF child care, TANF transportation, other TANF, and rental assistance/section 8/housing vouchers. Our new HMIS has eligibility functionality, so this will be evaluated during the coming year.

Updates are recorded in HMIS as appropriate (updated income and benefits information). Our new HMIS has a follow-up reminder function which we will deploy upon completion of the conversion.</p>
