*Eva Dillard - 12/13/2013 12:53:23 PM*, In order to report the correct number of beds for our communities PSH voucher beds in Q1b. we used the prorate calculation as asked by our AHAR liaison, which is  $(55145) / (365) = 151.082$ . Which amounts to 151 voucher beds. This is different than the 158 reported in our HIC, so we made the correction in Q1b.
